Message from the Co-Chairs

The past year has been a busy one for the National Parent-Child Mother Goose program.

The fundraising and membership committee has been active throughout the year planning and implementing donation campaigns and fundraising initiatives. The results have been encouraging, and with the increased financial stability the National Council can focus in coming years on expanding our funding sources and on building a strong foundation for future growth.

Discussions have been ongoing throughout much of 2017 with staff of the BC Provincial Office and with board and staff members of the Vermont Square program in Toronto, which manages the administration of training workshops and resource sales. We welcome the interest of Susan Ryan, Joel Kaplan, and the regional staff and board members in the national governance of the program, and look forward to continued conversations in the year ahead to plan for the future of the program.

The influence of the PCMG-P in schools, child care centres, libraries and homes across the country continues to grow. Even for those workshop participants who don't go on to lead a program, the connections made with others during the workshops and the inspiration from gifted teachers result in incalculable benefits to parents and children. Mother Goose reaches families in many ways:

- Pre-natal nurses incorporate the teaching of lullables into their pre-natal classes, so expectant parents are better prepared
- Rhyme circles are enriched
- New parents groups and library story times are influenced
- Nursery and kindergarten curricula have been permanently altered by exposure to PCMG-P.

We can be truly proud of what has been accomplished, and by what continues each day, in every program around the country. Statistics submitted to the National Council this year by the BC Council for Families, hosts of the provincial office for PCMG-P are welcome evidence of the continued growth of the program (see the Regional Office section of this report).

Program and Training Committee Report

The Program and Training Committee is a committee of National Council that deals with all aspects of our program guidelines and our training guidelines, development, and policy. It has been a full year of activity from around the country.

In January 2017 we held the second of our annual teleconference meetings with PCMGP's teacher training workshop facilitators. All the teacher trainers across Canada were invited to participate and had a chance to talk with each other about how they run their workshops, as well as to make suggestions regarding updates to the workshop forms. It was very valuable to hear from so many experienced as well as new facilitators, sharing their experiences, strengths, questions and input. We had almost full attendance and are planning the third of these meetings for January 2018.

In the 2016-2017 year, two new workshop facilitators applied and received their certificates to run the PCMGP Teacher Training Workshops: Carol Dwyer from St. John's, Newfoundland and Chantal Rogers, also from St. John's, Newfoundland.

In addition, Marie-Line Therriault from Montreal made a successful application, and finished her training in September 2017.

We worked on updates to our forms and resources, arising from the facilitator meeting, to be included in the Teacher Training Workshop package. Workshop facilitators have been asked to send any further suggestions they have for review by the committee.

Also arising from the workshop facilitator meetings, Lori offered to work on a digital compilation of research materials supporting PCGMP that could be used for program funding applications. This will be drawn from her own experience making funding applications for programs in Newfoundland as well as that of other facilitators across the country, and past compilations we have on file. The intent is to pool together the expertise and knowledge we have and then make it available for workshop facilitators to share, in the hopes that this will increase chances of further funding

for groups trying to get programs up and running. Lori will request information from the facilitators and collate it.

We welcome and appreciate the initiative of Lori Fritz in this, and the input of herself and Mary Fearon from Newfoundland, who have worked to compile research supporting the Parent-Child Mother Goose Program and made successful grant applications, over the past 20 years.

The self-evaluation process was reviewed and we confirmed that Catherine Taylor is receiving all self-evaluations that are sent, as requested on the form, to the National Office. She makes sure that applicants receive a timely response and a certificate is sent, upon receipt of the self-evaluation. If she sees reason for concern with a particular application, she will contact the Program and Training Committee to respond in more depth. We agreed that while it would be ideal to respond to each application in depth, we do not have resources to do so at this time.

International News

Maria Ordonez, a program teacher and workshop facilitator in Toronto, taught an Early Literacy and Numeracy course at University of Casa Grande of Guayaquil, Ecuador, which offers a flexible Master's Program in Early Human Development and Learning. Three students wrote their theses on a pilot project of a one-term Parent-Child Mother Goose Program in a very deprived area of Guayaquil.

Guita Movallali from Iran continues to be in touch with us regularly with information, research, and photographs from her PCMGP for families with deaf and hard of hearing children.

As always, we respond to questions and communications that come our way from across the country and abroad, relating to Program and/or Training guidelines.

We appreciate the opportunity to hear of the positive changes that the Parent-Child Mother Goose Program makes in the lives of families! We welcome ideas, questions and feedback from our membership. Contact us at any time.



Statistics submitted by the BC Provincial Office in May 2017 show that the program is continuing to grow in BC. Parent-Child Mother Goose programs were held in more than 20 communities across the province, with a total of 5537 children attending, and 5012 adults.
